ASK LEARNING RELAYS

DESCRIPTION AND CONSIDERATIONS:

A simple, fun, and effective way to incorporate any curriculum outcome into an ASK lesson. The sky is the limit here!

To reduce the competitive edge, remind students that there are no winners/losers with these relay races. Invite all students to participate to the best of their abilities.

To encourage more movement for all, consider creating smaller teams, or inviting students to run in pairs during the relay.

EXAMPLES

Worksheet relay: Place a worksheet on a clipboard for each team. Students take turns running/walking to answer one question off their team's worksheet at a time.

The relay continues until the worksheets are complete.

Envelope relay: Each team has an envelope containing a cut-up worksheet. The envelopes are placed a reasonable distance (depending on the age of your class). Players take turns running/walking to collect 1 question from their envelope and returning to their team with the question. The team answer the question together. One player from the team runs/walks to share their answer with the teacher. If the answer is correct, the play continues. If the answer is incorrect, the team must try again.

Play continues until all questions in each envelope have been answered.





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Whiteboard relay: Place a personal sized whiteboard at a reasonable distance from each team. Players from each team take turns running/walking to record their answer to a question on the whiteboard and display their answer for the teacher. This format is great for reviewing need-to-know spelling etc.
